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A Timeline of Progress

Great Moments In African American History

1776-1783

American Revolution

July 13 (1787)

The Northwest Ordinance bans the expansion of slavery into U.S. territories north of the Ohio River and east of the Mississippi

Mr. Foster

1780

Pennsylvania becomes the first U.S. state to abolish slavery

Mr. Casazza and Mr. Colfer

1808-1854

Pre-Civil War

January 1st (1808)

The importation of slaves is a felony. This is the earliest day under the United States Constitution that a law could be made restricting slavery

Mr. Vito and Mr. Frank

(1854)

In opposition to the Kansas-Nebraska Act, the Republican Party is formed with an anti-slavery platform

Mr. Akk

1861-1865

American Civil War

September 22nd (1862)

Lincoln announces the Emancipation Proclamation to go into effect on January 1st, 1863

January 31st, 1865

U.S. Congress passes the 13th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution abolishing slavery and submits it to the states for ratification

DID YOU KNOW?
Black ingenuity helped devise creative plans to escape enslavement. In 1848, husband-and-wife, William and Ellen Craft, made it to the North when she dressed as a white man and he posed as one of her slaves.

1866-1879

Reconstruction

April 9th (1866)

The Civil Rights Act of 1866 is passed by Congress over Johnson's presidential veto.

All people born in the U.S. are now citizens

Marshall

February 3rd (1870)

The 15th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution guarantees the right of male citizens of the U.S. to vote regardless of race, color or previous condition of servitude

December 11th (1872)

P.B.S. Pinchback is sworn in as the first black member of the U.S. House of Representatives

Mr. Scap

1880-1899

Post-Reconstruction

July 4th (1881)

Booker T. Washington opens the Tuskegee Normal and Industrial Institute in Tuskegee, Alabama.

Mr. Greg

(1895)

W. E. B. Du Bois is the first African-American to be awarded a Ph.D by Harvard University.

Mr. Paul

October 3rd (1887)

The State Normal School for Colored Students, which would become Florida A&M University, is founded.

Ida Wells-Barnett refused to give up her railcar seat for a white man in 1884 and bit a conductor on the hand when he tried to force her.

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20th Century 1900-1920

February 12th (1909)
Planned first meeting of group which would become the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), an interracial group devoted to civil rights.

1918
Viola Pettus, an African-American nurse in Marathon, Texas, wins attention for her courageous care of victims of the Spanish Influenza, including members of the Ku Klux Klan.

20th Century 1925-1949

(1939)
The Little League is formed, becoming the nation's first non-segregated youth sport.

April 15th (1947)
Jackie Robinson plays his first game for the Brooklyn Dodgers, becoming the first black baseball player in professional baseball in 60 years.

(1920)
Fritz Pollard and Bobby Marshall are the first two African-American players in the National Football League (NFL)

1945-1975 Civil Rights Movement

DID YOU KNOW?
Being mischievous was Thurgood Marshall's gateway to the law. For punishment, he was forced to copy the Constitution. It eventually piqued his interest.

May 17 (1954)
U.S. Supreme Court rules against the "separate but equal" doctrine in Brown v. Board of Education

May 17th (1957)
The Prayer Pilgrimage for Freedom in Washington D.C. is at the time the largest nonviolent demonstration for civil rights

January 18th (1958)
Willie O'Ree breaks the color barrier in the National Hockey League

20th Century 1960-1969

November 14th (1960)
Ruby Bridges becomes the first African-American child to attend an all-white elementary school in the South following court-ordered integration in New Orleans

July 2nd (1964)
Civil Rights Act of 1964 signed, banning discrimination based on "race, color, religion, sex or national origin" in employment practices and public accommodations

Black History Month is founded by Professor Carter Woodson's Association for the Study of Afro-American Life and History

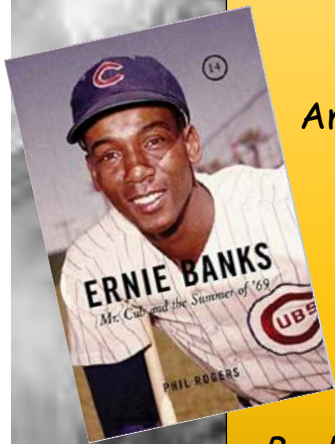
